Impact Investing

Carolyn Foundation currently holds \$5.8 million in social impact generating bonds in Minneapolis, MN and New Haven, CT. Our primary interests are in affordable housing, clean energy and education. Our other investment holdings have gone through screens to assure that we are not unwittingly holding investments that run counter to our priorities, particularly our Climate Change objectives.
